HISTORY

THE FIRE MARSHAL'S ASSOCIATION OF OKLAHOMA was chartered in November, 1990, as Chapter 7 of the Fire Marshal's Association of North America, a section of the National Fire Protection Association. The Fire Marshal's Association of Oklahoma also became a chapter member of the Building Official's and Code Administrator's, Inc. (BOCA) one of the legacy code organization to the current International Code Council of which the Fire Marshal's Association is a member of Region 10. The first meeting of the FMAO was held December 13 and 14, 1990 in Oklahoma City. The original membership numbered 300. The FMAO is a service organization providing its membership with a variety of educational opportunities and other services. In its first year, the FMAO sponsored several training and educational seminars and continues that tradition today.

ORGANIZATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The membership of the Fire Marshal's Association of Oklahoma all work towards common goals to assure a FIRE SAFE OKLAHOMA.

The purpose and objectives of the Fire Marshal's Association of Oklahoma are:

1. To assure a **FIRE SAFE OKLAHOMA** by supporting adoption and enforcement of modern fire codes, ordinances and State statutes, thus assisting all fire marshals in the conduct of their professional activities.
2. To assure a **FIRE SAFE OKLAHOMA** by informing and educating the citizens of Oklahoma on methods and ways to prevent death, injuries, and property loss due to fire and to unite for mutual benefit those officials engaged primarily in the prevention of fire.

3. To assure a **FIRE SAFE OKLAHOMA** by bringing to justice those who willfully and maliciously set fire to their own property or the property of others and to unite for mutual benefit those officials engaged primarily in the investigation and control of arson.

4. To assure a **FIRE SAFE OKLAHOMA** through the sharing of technical expertise and training to enhance professionalism and to correlate the activities of fire marshals toward the reduction of fire waste.

COMMITTEES

The Fire Marshal's Association of Oklahoma has several working committees. These are open to the membership for attendance and each committee is always looking for additional input in the form of new members or ideas from the membership. The Association also forms ad hoc committees to address areas of concern identified by its members.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE - to promote legitimate memberships in the FMAO; to audit the membership status of all members to assure compliance with the Constitution and By-laws.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE - To monitor any legislative issues that affect the business, duties, or enforcement activity of the fire marshal's of the State; to participate in the Oklahoma Municipal League legislative committee to effect appropriate change in Oklahoma laws pertaining to the work of the fire marshals in the State.

MEMBERSHIPS AVAILABLE

1. **REGULAR MEMBER** - A full-time salaried government and/or volunteer fire official with statutory responsibility for the prevention of the fires through the enforcement of laws or regulations, property inspections, fire safety education, or the investigation of fires.
2. **ASSOCIATE MEMBER.** (a) the part-time non-salaried designated officials of a county, municipality, or quasi-municipality authorized and obligated by public law or lawful ordinance with the duty of the fire prevention through property inspections, enforcement of the fire laws and regulations and public education or who may be charged with the duty of investigating the cause and origin of fires, or (b) the individual who was previously a regular member but cannot qualify due to change in assignment or retirement, or © individuals motivated to support the objectives and technical programs of the FMAO or otherwise prompted to benefit by and contribute to the work of the organization.
